# Tudor Day Out

Suitable for KS1/2 | Duration: 2 hours 30 minutes | Price: £5 per pupil | Curriculum Topics: Local History, Art

In this fun and interactive workshop students will experience what it was like to live in Tudor Warwick and immerse themselves into Tudor Society. Students will travel back in time to 1571 to learn about Robert Dudley, Earl of Leicester and why he decided to set up his Hospital for military veterans.



# Building the Lord Leycester

Suitable for KS1/2 | Duration: 2 hours 30 minutes | Price: £5 per pupil | Curriculum Topics: History, Art & Design



Students will explore the Medieval site of the Lord Leycester to investigate some of the intentional design in place and develop their own designs based on this. Through play and discussion students will be able to compare historical methods of building with modern and learn about the importance of the site and its history.

### **Is there a lunchroom on site?**

Unfortunately, we are not able to provide a lunch space on site.

### **What is the staffing requirement?**

Our team provides at least two members of staff for each visit but we require schools to adhere to Ofsted recommended ratios:

4-8 years    1 adult: 6 children  
9-12 years    1 adult: 8 children

The Lord Leycester will have the right to turn away groups that do not have suitable adult to child ratios. On occasion children will need to have 1:1 support. This will be applicable if it is 'normal practice' for the child in question.

### **Do you have a Risk Assessment?**

A Risk Assessment along with other pre booking information will be sent to you upon booking.

### **Do you offer teacher planning visits?**

Yes, free teacher planning visits are available, with the option to bring an additional adult or child.

### **Is the site accessible?**

The Guildhall is accessible via stairs or a lift.

If your group has any additional needs or allergies, please let the education team know at the time of booking and we will endeavour to make the learning accessible for your individual needs.

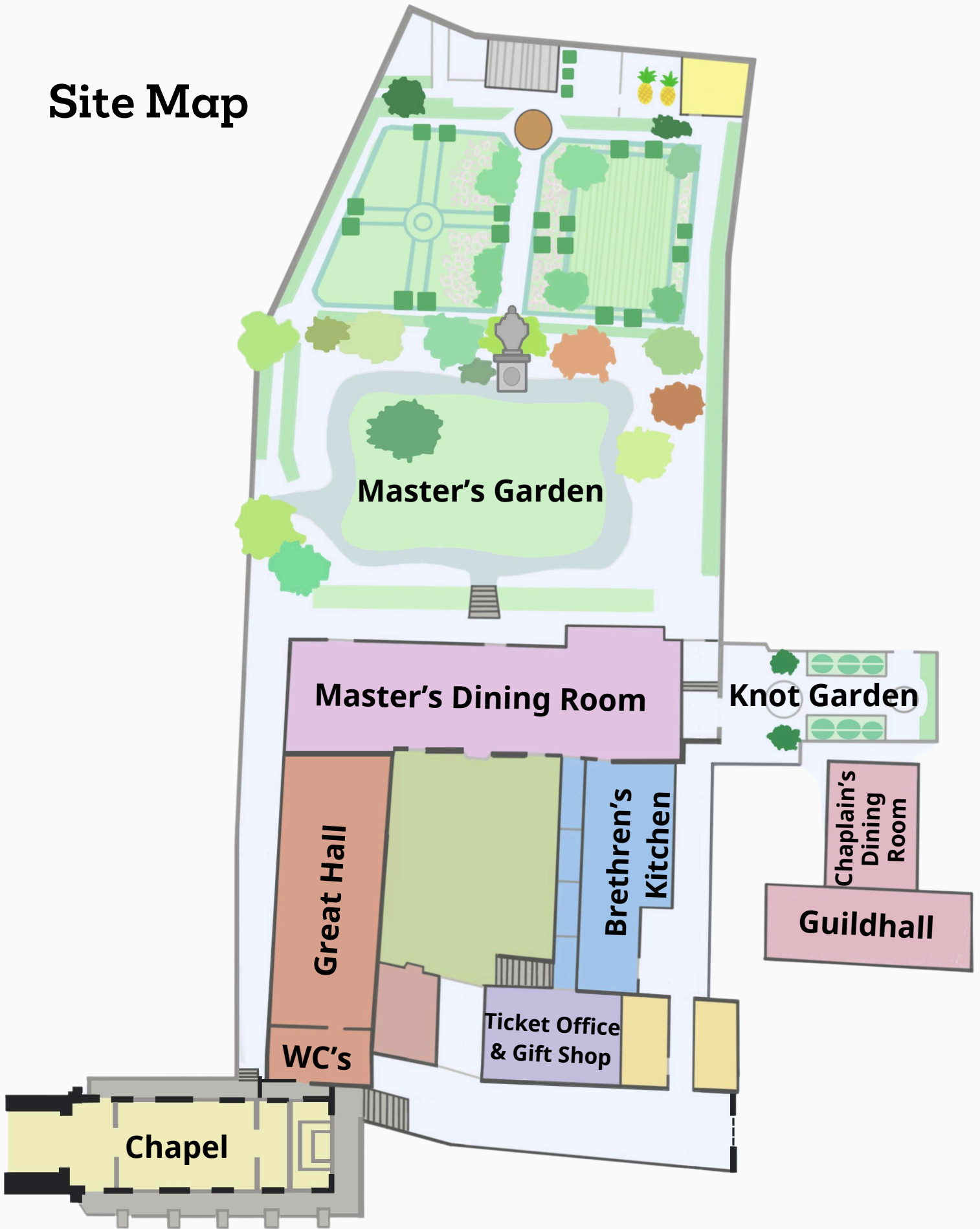
### **How to find us**
